
2022 Governor's Points of Light Award Nomination


Nevada Volunteers is a non-profit organization dedicated to creating a culture of service and citizenship in Nevada. The Governor's Points of Light Award is the highest honor bestowed by Nevada Volunteers and the State, recognizing individuals and organizations whose dedication, innovation, and leadership make Nevada a better place to live. The finalists of the Points of Light Award inspire Nevadans to make a positive impact through volunteerism.

This year we celebrate the 20th Anniversary of the Governor's Points of Light Awards! We look forward to sharing the stories of another round of extraordinary individuals and organizations as well as celebrating with past recipients and honorees.

Another exciting change we are pleased to share is that the nomination period will remain open the entire year, allowing nominators to submit their forms anytime. Nominations for the 2022 event will be accepted until 5pm on June 15, 2022. Submissions received after 5pm on June 15th, 2022 will be included in the nomination pool for the 2023 event. Please keep that deadline in mind if you wish your nomination to be considered for the 2022 Awards.







NOMINATION INFORMATION AND ELIGIBILTY REQUIREMENTS

Nominations for the 2022 Governor's Points of Light Awards are due prior to 5:00pm PST on June 15, 2022. Entries received after that will be included in the nomination pool for the 2023 event.

All entries must be submitted online via this form prior to the deadline listed above. Choose only one category per nomination.

- Individual nominees must be Nevada Residents
- Group nominations must be Nevada organizations
- All service must have been performed in Nevada
- Nevada Volunteers staff and commissioners are not eligible
- Individuals receiving a stipend or salary, with the exception of national service members and volunteer managers, are not eligible
- 2021 Finalists are not eligible to be a finalist in the same category until 2023

Gold, Silver and Bronze awardees will be announced at the Governor's Points of Light Awards on October 20, 2022 at The Blind Center in Las Vegas. Nevada Volunteers reserves the right to select an alternate recipient should the nominee be unable to accept the award in person. Organizations and/or individuals being nominated should notify Nevada Volunteers if travel assistance is requested.

ABOUT THE NOMINATION AND REVIEW PROCESS

Once the current nomination period is closed, all nominations are reviewed by Nevada Volunteers staff for accuracy and completion. The nominations are then forwarded to the judging committee which is comprised of representatives from northern, southern and rural Nevada, as well as representatives from nonprofit organizations, corporate business and volunteer management programs. Each nomination is scored and the final scores are submitted to the Judging Chair. All references are contacted and the top 3 finalists in each category are notified. Nominators of all non-selected finalists are also notified.

Nominations are accepted in seven categories:

* Individual Volunteer (18 or older)

(An individual volunteer at least 18 years of age who has demonstrated extraordinary achievement in volunteerism and service in Nevada).

* Individual Youth Volunteer (under 18)

(An individual under 18 years of age who has demonstrated extraordinary achievement in volunteerism and service in Nevada).

* National Service Member

(Any National Service Member serving within AmeriCorps, VISTA, NCCC or AmeriCorps Seniors who has completed a term of service in Nevada in the past year or is on track to complete a term of service in 2022 and who has demonstrated extraordinary achievement in service).

* Nonprofit and Community Organization Volunteer Program

(A non-profit or community organization whose volunteer program has demonstrated extraordinary achievement in volunteerism and service in Nevada).

* Corporate and Business Volunteer Program

(A business or corporation whose volunteer program has demonstrated extraordinary achievement in volunteerism and service in Nevada).

* Volunteer Manager

(Any volunteer manager or administrator who has demonstrated extraordinary achievement in leadership and management of volunteers in Nevada).

* Community Leadership

(Any service or volunteer group, faith-based group, civic group and/or family group that has shown extraordinary achievements in their top leadership, community service and collaboration in Nevada).

* Lifetime Achievement

(Any individual who has demonstrated extraordinary achievement in volunteerism and service in Nevada for a period of 20 or more years. Service does not necessarily need to be with the same organization for that period of time but must have been performed in the state of Nevada).

* Veterans/Military Organization

(A non-profit, volunteer group or organization serving veterans or military personnel, or who is a part of our veterans and military personnel which has demonstrated extraordinary achievement in their volunteerism in Nevada).

The American Women Quarters Program is a four-year program that celebrates the accomplishments and contributions made by women to the development and history of our country. Beginning in 2022, and continuing through 2025, the U.S. Mint will issue up to five new reverse designs each year.

Maya Angelou

1928 - 2014



Marguerite Ann Johnson, known to the world as Maya Angelou, was a poet, dancer, singer, activist, scholar and a world-famous author. She was best known for her unique and pioneering auto-biographical writing style.

Sally Ride

1951 - 2012



Sally Ride was the first American woman in space. She made her journey into history on June 18, 1983. Throughout her life, Dr. Ride broke barriers and worked to ensure that girls and women were encouraged to do the same.

Wilma Mankiller

1945 - 2010



Wilma Mankiller is the first female Principal Chief of the Cherokee Nation. She is also the first woman elected as chief of a major Native tribe. She spent her remarkable life fighting for the rights of American Indians.

Adelina Otero-Warren

1881 - 1965



Adelina Otero-Warren was the first female superintendent of public schools in Santa Fe, and the first Hispanic woman to run for U.S. Congress. She was a leader in New Mexico's woman's suffrage movement and spearheaded the lobbying effort to ratify the 19th Amendment in New Mexico.

Anna May Wong

1905 - 1961



Anna May Wong was Hollywood's first Chinese American film star, appearing in over sixty movies. Beside roles in silent films, television, and stage, Wong starred in one of the first movies made in Technicolor. Her internationally legacy continues to influence entertainers around the world.
