# Memorable Events in July

**July 4, 1776** – The Birth of the United States, as the Second Continental Congress unanimously adopted the "Declaration of Independence" announcing the colonies' separation from Great Britain.

**July 19-20, 1848** – The Birth of the Women's Rights Movement, as the Seneca Fall Women's Rights Conference adopted the "Declaration of Sentiments" calling for women's equality and suffrage.

**July 4, 1876** – The unveiling of the "Declaration of the Rights of Women" written by Matilda joselyn Gage.

**July 20, 1942** – The first Women's Auxiliary Army Corps (WAAC) class began at Fort Des Moines, Iowa.

**July 2, 1964** – President Lyndon Johnson signed the Civil Rights Act; Title VII prohibiting sex discrimination in employment.

**July 29, 1974** – Eleven female deacons became the first ordained female U.S. Episcopal priests. They were called the "Philadelphia Eleven."

Historical Note: Clarissa Danforth was the first woman ordained by the Free Will Baptist denomination (1815). Antoinette Brown Blackwell was the first female minister of the Congregationalist Church (1853). Regina Jonas was the world's first ordained female rabbi (1935). Denise Wyss was the first ordained priest in the Old Catholic Church (2000). Wu Chengzhen was the first female principal abbot in Taoism's 1,800-year history (2009). Barbara Harris was the first female bishop of the U.S. Episcopal Church (1989), and Libby Lane was the first female bishop of the Church of England (2015).

**July 9, 1978** – One hundred thousand supporters of equality marched in Washington D.C. calling for an extension of the deadline for ratification of the Equal Rights Amendment. At the time, the largest march for women's rights in U.S. history.

**July 2, 1979** - 847 million Susan B. Anthony (SBA) dollars were released for circulation. Another 9.7 million SBA dollars were minted for numismatic sets.

**July 7, 1981** – President Reagan nominated Sandra Day O'Connor as the first woman Supreme Court Justice.

**July 12, 1984** - Geraldine Ferraro (U.S. House of Rep. N.Y.) became the first woman vice president nominee of a major political party (Democratic), running with presidential nominee Walter Mondale.

**July 26, 2016** - Hillary Clinton (U.S. Senate N.Y., Secretary of State, First Lady) became the first woman president nominee of a major political party (Democratic), running with vice presidential nominee Tim Kaine.

### Saxon the Suffrage Cat History

Saxon the Suffrage Cat was adopted as a kitten by Nell Richardson and Alice Burke. He traveled with them on a 10,000-mile cross-country trip in 1916 to promote the Women's Right to Vote. He became a symbol of the women's suffrage movement. Saxon was named after the Saxon motorcar they drove on this historic trip, which took the ladies over dirt, or at best graded roads paved with gravel, from April 6 to September 30, 1916. Richardson and Burke's unusual journey caught the attention of people across the country who followed Saxon's growth as they traveled from town to town.
