

American Women Quarters Program

Each year from 2022 and through 2025, the United States Mint will issue five quarters annually, for a total of twenty quarters, honoring the wide range of accomplishments women have made in fields from suffrage, civil rights, abolition, government, humanities, science, space, and the arts.

These women represent the rich heritage that exists within our ethnically, racially, and geographically diverse society, a heritage that is indelibly etched into the American culture. These women are examples of what can be accomplished with vision, determination and a desire to improve opportunities for all.

2022 Honorees



Maya Angelou—celebrated writer, performer, social activist.

Dr. Sally Ride—physicist, astronaut, educator, and first American woman to soar into space.

Wilma Mankiller—first woman elected principal chief of the Cherokee Nation and an activist for Native American and women’s rights.

Nina Otero-Warren—a leader in New Mexico’s suffrage movement and the first female superintendent of Santa Fe public schools.

Anna May Wong—first Chinese American film star in Hollywood, who left a legacy for women in the film industry.

2023 Honorees



Bessie Coleman – pilot, advocate, and pioneer. First African American and first Native American woman pilot, first African American to earn an international pilot’s license.

Jovita Idar – Mexican American journalist, activist, teacher, and suffragist. Fought to create a better future for Mexican Americans.

Edith Kanaka’ole – indigenous Hawaiian composer, chanter, dancer, teacher, and entertainer. Her stories rescued aspects of Hawaiian history, customs, and traditions that were disappearing due to cultural bigotry of the time.

Eleanor Roosevelt – first lady, author, reformer, and leader. She oversaw the creation of the Universal Declaration of Human Rights, and advocated for the civil liberties and needs of the poor, minorities, and the disadvantaged.

Maria Tallchief – America’s first prima ballerina, and first Native American ballerina.


Saxon the Suffrage Cat History

Saxon the Suffrage Cat was adopted as a kitten by Nell Richardson and Alice Burke. He traveled with them on a 10,000-mile cross-country trip in 1916 to promote the Women's Right to Vote. He became a symbol of the women's suffrage movement. Saxon was named after the Saxon motorcar they drove on this historic trip, which took the ladies over dirt, or at best graded roads paved with gravel, from April 6 to September 30, 1916. Richardson and Burke's unusual journey caught the attention of people across the country who followed Saxon's growth as they traveled from town to town.

Phlebotomy–Fall 2023

Course Information

Phlebotomists usually work under the direction of a lead phlebotomist or medical technologist. The phlebotomist collects blood specimens for analysis, checks the quality of the sample and assumes responsibility for the safety and comfort of patients during the procedure. The phlebotomist must have sufficient venipuncture skills to collect blood from babies, children, adults, and the elderly or "hard to stick" patients. They must also be able to accurately perform skin punctures, blood culture collection and other special laboratory tests.

ATTENTION: Collection of at least 15 live person venipuncture collections performed in a simulated clinical setting must be performed after successful completion of the 12-week phlebotomy lecture and laboratory portion of the class. This course is specific for obtaining the NHA credential.

Students pursuing Medical Lab Technician (MLT) or Medical Lab Scientist (MLS) declared degrees must apply for admission to the Phlebotomy Skills Certificate (MLT/MLS Track) Program which includes CLS 151,152, and 153 phlebotomy courses.

This curriculum prepares graduates to perform basic nursing and restorative care for patients involving safety, personal hygiene, nutrition, mobility, basic mental health, patient protections and rights, observing the patient, and reporting to the nurse.

Requirements to participate in the clinical portion of this class

- ✓ Proof of negative 2-step TB skin test OR QuantiFERON Gold blood test
- ✓ Negative drug test
- ✓ Physical examination
- ✓ Carry medical insurance
- ✓ CPR Certified (American Heart Association, Healthcare Provider)
- ✓ COVID-19 Vaccination

Prerequisite: Have either completed ENG 100/101 with a C or better or achieved a score of 237 or higher on the Next Generation Accuplacer Reading test.
