AUGUST SPOTLIGHT: PEO Philanthropic Educational Organization

P.E.O. is a non-profit organization whose mission is to celebrate the advancement of women; educate women through scholarships, grants, awards, and loans; and motivate women to achieve their highest aspirations.

It is diverse and community-based, with 6,000 chapters in all fifty States, the District of Columbia and six Canadian provinces, with roughly 220,00 members. The city of Mesquite has two P.E.O. chapters.

P.E.O. was originally founded as a sorority at Wesleyan College in Iowa in 1869, the second sorority in the U.S. The sorority chapters grew rapidly and P.E.O. became International in 1911 when a chapter was started in Vancouver, Canada. Since then, P.E.O. has evolved into more of a community-based organization than a sorority.

Today, P.E.O. fulfills its core mission with programs that provide assistance to women for higher education through six educational philanthropies, one of which is Cottey College, a liberal arts and sciences college for women. Cottey College is located in Nevada, Missouri, and serves 350 students typically from the United States and twenty-five other countries.

As of 2023, P.E.O. has awarded nearly \$415 million through the following programs:

- P.E.O. Educational Loan Fund (ELF), which lends money to qualified women students to assist them in securing a higher education.
- P.E.O. International Peace Scholarship Fund (IPS), which provides scholarships for international women students to pursue graduate study in United States and Canada.
- P.E.O. Program for Continuing Education (PCE), which offers need-based grants to women in the U.S. and Canada whose education has been interrupted and who find it necessary to return to school to support themselves and/or their families.
- P.E.O. Scholar Awards (PSA), which provides substantial merit-based awards for women of the U.S. and Canada who are pursuing a doctoral level degree at an accredited college or university.
- P.E.O. STAR Scholarship (STAR), which offers scholarships for exceptional high school senior women to attend an accredited post-secondary educational institution in the United States or Canada in the following academic year.


