Books at Our Center About Notable Women Born in April

Maya Angelou (April 4, 1928 - 2014)

Internationally recognized memoirist, poet and civil rights activist, whose plays, movies and television shows span over 50 years.

• I Know Why the Caged Bird Sings (Maya Angelou's first autobiography) All seven of Angelou's autobiographies are available in our library.

Mary Pickford (April 8, 1892 - 1953)

The most successful silent film actress, starring in 74 films. Pickford was one of the five investors who started The United Artists production company.

• Mary Pickford: Queen of the Movies

Florence Price (April 9, 1887 - 1953)

Composer of over 300 musical works, symphonies, concertos, songs and chamber music. The first African-American woman to have her composition played by a major orchestra.

• The Heart of a Woman: Life and Music of Florence Price

Anne Sullivan Macy (April 14, 1866 - 1936)

A teacher who at age 5 was partially blind without reading or writing skills and became famous for working with Helen Keller who was blind, deaf and mute.

• Helen's Eyes: A Photobiography of Annie Sullivan, Helen Keller's Teacher

Carol Burnett (April 26, 1933 -)

Popular actress, comedian, singer, with a 50-year career on Broadway and television, including being one of the first women to host a comedy-variety show.

• One More Time: A Memoir of Carol Burnett

Coretta Scott King (April 27, 1933 -2006)

Author, activist and civil rights leader, who worked side by side with Martin Luther King, Jr. and successfully lobbied to have his birthday recognized as a federal holiday.

April Highlights in United States Women's History

- **April 2**, 1931: 17-year-old Jackie Mitchell, the second woman to play baseball in the all-male minor leagues, pitched an exhibition game against the N.Y. Yankees and struck out Babe Ruth and Lou Gehrig. In retaliation, the baseball commissioner banned women from playing baseball. The ban stayed in effect until 1992.
- **April 5**, 1911: 100,000 to 500,000 people marched in New York City at the funeral of seven victims of the Triangle Shirtwaist Company fire in late March. 146 of the 500 women and children who worked in those dangerous, overcrowded sweatshop conditions died. This was the start of modern building, fire and safety codes in the U.S.
- **April 7**, 1805: Sacagawea joined the Lewis and Clark Expedition as an interpreter.
- **April 7**, 1987: The National Museum of Women in the Arts, the first museum devoted to women artists, opened in Washington, D.C.
- **April 9**, 1939: The African American contralto, Marian Anderson, performed at an Easter Sunday concert for more than 75,000 at Lincoln Memorial, at the invitation of Eleanor Roosevelt after the Daughters of the American Revolution cancelled her appearance at Washington's Constitution Hall because she was black. Eleanor increased public awareness of the existence of racial discrimination.
- **April 13**, 1933: Ruth Bryan Owens was the first woman to represent the U.S. as a foreign minister when she was appointed envoy to Denmark.
- **April 16**, 1912: Harriet Quimby was the first woman to make a solo flight across the English Channel.
- **April 19**, 1977: Fifteen women in the House of Representatives formed the Congressional Caucus for Women's Issues.
- **April 22**, 1970: Earth Day was established to honor Rachel Carson, author of Silent Spring. She documented the adverse effects of indiscriminate use of pesticides, greatly influencing the environmental movement and changing America.
- **April 26**, 1777: The 16-year-old American Revolution heroine, Sybil Ludington, rode 40 miles on horseback at night in a driving rainstorm to warn American militia the British were coming. Unlike Paul Revere, she evaded capture by the British on her ride.
- **April 28**, 1993: The first "Take Our Daughters to Work" Day was sponsored by the Ms. Foundation. In 2003, it became "Take Our Daughters and Sons to Work" Day.

Saxon the Suffrage Cat History

Saxon the Suffrage Cat was adopted as a kitten by Nell Richardson and Alice Burke. He traveled with them on a 10,000-mile cross-country trip in 1916 to promote the Women's Right to Vote. He became a symbol of the women's suffrage movement. Saxon was named after the Saxon motorcar they drove on this historic trip, which took the ladies over dirt, or at best, graded roads paved with gravel, from April 6 to September 30, 1916. Richardson and Burke's unusual journey caught the attention of people across the country who followed Saxon's growth as they traveled from town to town.

The Cat

The 10,000 Mile Journey
