Books at Our Center About Notable Women Born in July

Olivia de Haviland (July 1, 1916 - 2020)

Actress, winner of the Academy Award for Best Actress in 1946 and 1949, played Melanie in "Gone With the Wind." • Olivia de Haviland: Lady Triumphant

Anna Hedgeman (July 5, 1899 - 1990)

Civil rights activist and educator, first African American woman to serve in the cabinet of the New York mayor (1954-58), helped plan the 1963 March on Washington.
Until There is Justice: The Life of Anna Arnold Hedgeman

Eunice Kennedy Shriver (July 10, 1938 - 2009)

Founded the Special Olympics, a sports organization of persons with intellectual disabilities. • Eunice: The Kennedy Who Changed the World

• Eunice Kennedy Shriver: Inspiring Olympics for All

Janet Reno (July 21, 1938 - 2018)

First woman to serve as U. S. Attorney General (1993 – 2001, under President Clinton). • Janet Reno: First Woman Attorney General

Amelia Earhart (July 24, 1897 - 1937)

Noted aviation pioneer and author, first woman to fly solo across the Atlantic, first person to fly solo across the Pacific from Hawaii to the mainland.

• Amelia Earhart: Beyond the Grave • The Sound of Wings

Jacqueline Bouvier Kennedy Onassis (July 28, 1929 - 1994)

First Lady (1961-63), photographer and book editor, who campaigned to restore and preserve historic landmarks and established the White House Historical Association. • A Woman Named Jackie

Bella Abzug (July 24, 1920 - 1998)

Lawyer, political activist, U.S. Congressional Representative from New York (1973-77), initiated the proposal for Women's Equality Day.

July Highlights in United States Women's History

July is the celebration of two essential democratic anniversaries: The Birth of the United States on July 4, 1776, and The Birth of the Women's Rights Movement on July 19 to 20, 1848.

- July 2, 1979 The Susan B. Anthony dollar was released.
- July 2, 1937 Amelia Earhart's plane is lost in the Pacific Ocean near Howland Island.
- **July 2, 1964** President Lyndon Johnson signed the Civil Rights Act; Title VII which prohibits sex discrimination in employment.
- July 4, 1876 Suffragists crashed the Centennial Celebration in Independence Hall to present the Vice President with the "Declaration of the Rights of Women" written by Matilda Joselyn Gag.
- **July 6, 1957** Althea Gibson was the first African American woman player to win a Wimbledon title in women's tennis singles.
- **July 7, 1981** President Reagan nominated Sandra Day O'Connor as the first woman Supreme Court Justice.
- **July 12, 1984** Representative Geraldine Ferraro (D-New York) was chosen as the first female to run for Vice President of the United States on the Democratic Party ticket with Walter Mondale (D-Minnesota).
- **July 14, 1917** Sixteen women from the National Women's Party were arrested while picketing the White House demanding universal women's suffrage; they were charged with obstructing traffic.
- **July 19-20, 1848** The Seneca Falls Convention, the country's first women's rights convention, was held in Seneca Falls, New York.
- **July 20, 1942** The first class of Women's Auxiliary Army Corps (WAAC) began at Fort Des Moines, IA.




