Books at Our Center about Notable Women Born in October

June Alemida (October 5, 1930 -)

Virologist who first discovered the coronavirus family and created techniques that led to huge strides in viral imaging and diagnosis. June Alemida, Virus Detective: The Woman Who Discovered the First Human Coronavirus

Jody Williams (October 9, 1950 -)

Nobel Peace Prize winner in 1997 for her work toward banning and clearing anti-personnel mines and defending human rights, especially those of women. My Name is Jody Williams: A Vermont Girl's Winding Path to the Nobel Peace Prize

Doris Payne (October 10, 1930 -)

International jewel thief with a 60-year long career. Her last arrest was at age 80 for stealing a diamond ring at Macy's. Diamond Doris: The True Story of the World's Most Notorious Jewel Thief

Annie Smith Peck (October 19, 1850 – July 18, 1935)

61-year-old Suffragist who climbed the 21,083 tall Coropuna Peak in Peru in 1911 and placed a "Votes for Women" banner at its summit. Her final climb was at age 82. A Woman's Place is at the Top: A Biography of Annie Smith Peck, Queen of the Climbers

Kamala Harris (October 20, 1964 -)

U.S. Vice President (2021-24), California Senator (2017-21), California Attorney General (2011-17) and San Francisco District Attorney (2004-11) **The Truths We Hold Dear: An American Journey**

Indra Nooyi (October 28, 1955 -)

Chairman and C.E.O. of PepsiCo from 2006 to 2018, ranked #1 on Fortune's "Most Powerful Women in Business" List in 2009 and 2010. My Life in Full: Work, Family and Our Future Indra Nooyi, Mover and Shaker

October Highlights in Women's History

- **October 3,** 2023: Kim Ng became the first female general manager to take a Major League Baseball team to the playoffs (Miami Marlins).
- **October 4,** 1976: Barbara Walters became the first woman co-anchor of the evening news (at ABC).
- **October 4,** 1993: Ruth Bader Ginsburg joined the U.S. Supreme Court as its second woman Justice.
- **October 8**, 1993: Toni Morrison became the first African American woman to win the Nobel Prize for Literature.
- **October 9,** 2023: Claudia Goldin was the first solo woman awarded the Nobel Prize in Economics for studying the obstacles women face in obtaining equal pay.
- **October 10,** 1983: Dr. Barbara McClintock received the Nobel Prize for Medicine for her discovery in genetics about mobile genetic elements.
- **October 11,** 1890: The Daughters of the American Revolution were founded in Washington, D.C. The Sons of the American Revolution, which was founded in New York city on April 30, 1889, would not allow women to join.
- **October 11,** 1984: Dr. Kathryn D. Sullivan was the first U.S. woman astronaut to "walk" in space during Challenger flight.
- **October 15,** 1948: Dr. Frances L. Willoughby was the first woman doctor in the regular U.S. Navy.
- **October 16,** 1916: Margaret Sanger opened the U.S.'s first birth control clinic in Brooklyn, New York.
- **October 23,** 1910: Blanche Stuart Scott was the first American woman pilot to make a public flight.
- **October 24,** 1901: Annie Edson Taylor, age 46, became the first person to survive going over Niagara Falls in a barrel. The barrel weighed 160 pounds and had a 150-pound anvil at its bottom, a screwed-on lid and mattress and padding for Annie. Her comment when rescued, "Nobody ought ever do that again."
- **October 24,** 1956: Reverend Margaret Towner was the first woman ordained a minister in the Presbyterian Church.
- **October 28,** 1958: Mary Roebling was the first woman director of a stock exchange (American Stock Exchange).

WOMEN IN MALE DOMINATED FIELDS - POLITICAL LEADERS SERIES

#1: WOMEN APPOINTED HEAD OF STATE IN THE MONTH OF OCTOBER

Note: Many current and former women presidents and prime ministers are members of the Council of Women World Leaders, an international network whose mission is to mobilize the highest-level women leaders globally for collective action on issues of critical importance to women and equitable development.

October 19, 1993: Benazir Bhutto

11th and 13th Prime Minister of Pakistan, serving from 1993 to 1996 and earlier from 1988 to 1990. Benazir was the first woman leader of a Muslim nation in modern history. She was repeatedly imprisoned and accused of corruption and nepotism, while at the same time pushing for reforms, including economic privatization, women's rights, civilian oversight of the military and opposition to growing Islamist violence. She was assassinated on December 27, 2007.

October 7, 1999: Adrienne Clarkson

26th Governor General of Canada, serving from 1999 to 2005.

Adrienne was the first Chinese American and refugee to be appointed Governor General of Canada, and the second woman after Jeanne Sauve to serve in that position. She was one of the first minority figures to hold a prominent position on Canadian TV, an Award-winning reporter, author and TV host over a 30-year career.

October 3, 2002: Maria das Neves

11th Prime Minister of Sao Tome and Principe, serving from 2002 to 2004.

Maria is a professor of Economics and the first woman head of government in the country, having served in major government posts as Minister of Economics, Finance, Trade, Industry and Tourism.

October 3, 2011: Helle Thorning-Schmidt

26th Prime Minister of Denmark, serving from 2011 to 2015.

Helle was Denmark's first female Prime Minister and Leader of the Social Democrats from 2005 to 2015. She served as CEO of Save the Children International from 2016 to 2019.

October 16, 2013: Erna Solberg

35th Prime Minister of Norway, serving from 2013 to 2021, re-elected in 2017.

Erna was the second woman elected to that position after Gro Harlem Brundtland, and has been the Conservative Party Leader since 2004. Her interest is in gender issues, like girl's rights and education, and she joined the board of Global Citizen in 2022 to help mobilize people, especially young people around the world, to fight poverty and achieve the UN's sustainability goals.

October 28, 2015: Bidya Devi Bhandari

2nd President of Nepal, serving from 2015 to 2023.

Besides being the second President of the Republic of Nepal, Bidya was the first President after the promulgation of the Constitution of Nepal in 2015. A resolution in this 2015 Constitution guarantees at least 33% women representation at every level of Nepal's political structure. This was the result of her determined effort as the three-term President of the All Nepal Women Association, whose goal was to end gender-based inequities and discrimination and ensure it was part of the new constitution.

October 10, 2016: Kersti Kaljulaid

5th President of Estonia, serving from 2016 to 2021.

Kersti is the first and only female head of state and the youngest president at age 46. Kersti was the first woman to head a power plant in Estonia. She heads the PRAXIS Center for Policy Studies, chairs the Development Monitoring Advisory Board at the chancellery of Estonian Parliament, and co-chaired the United Nations High-Level Panel on the Teaching Profession, alongside Paula-Mae Weekes.

#1: WOMEN APPOINTED HEAD OF STATE IN THE MONTH OF OCTOBER

October 2, 2017: Julie Payette

29th Governor General of Canada, serving from 2017 to 2021.

Julie was the Canadian Space Agency's chief astronaut and the first Canadian astronaut to board the International Space Station. An accomplished musician and athlete, Payette serves on the Canadian Olympic Committee's board of directors.

October 26, 2017: Jacinda Ardern

40th Prime Minister of New Zealand, serving from 2017 to 2023.

Jacinda was the world's youngest female head of government at age 37. After the Christchurch mass shooting in March 2019, she passed legislation to ban semi-automatic weapons in just ten days. Her elimination strategy during the first wave of COVID-19 gave New Zealand one of the lowest COVID-19-related death rates in the Western world. Of New Zealand's five-million population, less than 2,500 fatalities were reported.

October 25, 2018: Sahle-Work Zewde

5th President of Ethiopia, serving from 2018 to today.

Sahle is the first woman elected to this position, elected unanimously by members of the Federal Parliamentary Assembly. She heads the United Nations Office to the African Union, at the level of Under-Secretary-General.

October 27, 2019: Sophie Wilmes

70th Prime Minister of Belgium, serving from 2019 to 2020.

Wilmes also served as Belgium's Minister of Foreign Affairs from 2019 to 2020, the first women in both positions. She is currently Vice-President of the European Parliament.

October 11, 2021: Najla Bouden

41st Prime Minister of Tunisia, serving from 2021 to 2023.

Najla is the first female prime minister both in Tunisia and in the Arab world. She is a university professor specializing in geosciences, seismic hazards and earthquake engineering.

October 21, 2021: Cindy Kiro

22nd Governor-General of New Zealand, 2021 to today.

Cindy is the first Maori woman and the third person of Maori descent to hold this office. As a public-health academic, administrator and advocate, she is a champion for social justice, equity and public health.

October 22, 2022: Giorgia Meloni

31st Prime Minister of Italy, 2022 to today.

Besides being the first female prime minister of Italy, Meloni is the first not to have a university education. Her political schooling started in her early years as a hard right political activist, entering Parliament at age 29 and becoming minister of youth in Italy's Chamber of Deputies in 2008, the youngest in Italy's history.

October 2, 2023: Sylvanie Burton

9th President of Dominica, 2023 to today.

Sylvanie is the first woman and first Indigenous (Kalinago) president of Dominica, with prior experience in the many Ministries, including Community Development, Environment, Rural Modernization, Foreign Affairs, Trade, Youth, Social Services and the Ministry of Kalinago Affairs.

October 1, 2024: Claudia Sheinbaum

66th President of Mexico, 2024 to today.

Claudia is the first woman in 200 years elected to this position, winning the Mexican general election in a landslide. Claudia has a Doctorate in energy engineering and has authored over 100 articles and two books on energy, the environment and sustainable development.
