Abigail Adams (November 11, 1744 - 1818)

U.S. Postage Stamp honoring her: 22¢ in 1985 A politically influential First Lady who was an early advocate for women's rights

Georgia O'Keeffe (November 15, 1887- 1986)

U.S. Postage Stamps honoring her: 32¢ in 1996 and Forever Stamp in 2013 Innovative painter known for her oversized close-up paintings of flowers and landscapes

U.S. Postage Stamp honoring her: 5¢ in 1940 Author of *Little Women*

November Highlights in Women's History

- **November 1, 1848:** The first medical school for women, the New England Female Medical School, opened. In 1874, it merged with Boston University to become one of the world's first co-ed medical schools.
- **November 3, 1992:** Carol Moseley-Braun was the first African American woman elected to the U.S. Senate representing the state of Illinois.
- **November 5, 1992:** Shirley Chisholm was the first African American woman elected to the House of Representatives, representing the state of New York.
- **November 5, 1872:** Susan B. Anthony voted for the first time in the presidential election. She was arrested, tried without being allowed to testify in her own defense, and found guilty of illegal voting.
- **November 4, 1956**: The first televised presidential debate was held between two women on the CBS program, *Face the Nation*. Democrat Eleanor Roosevelt and Republican Margaret Chase Smith debated as proxies for presidential candidates Adlai Stevenson and Dwight Eisenhower. Four years later John F. Kennedy and Richard Nixon had their televised debate, the first between presidential candidates.
- **November 6, 1987**: Tania Aebi completed a solo circumnavigation of the globe in a 26-foot sailboat between the ages of 18 and 21, making her the first American woman and the youngest person to sail around the world.
- **November 7, 1916**: Suffragist Jennifer Rankin was elected to the U.S. House of Representatives from the state of Montana. Besides being the first woman to win a seat in Congress, she did it four years before women had the right to vote.
- **November 8, 1910**: The state of Washington passed a constitutional amendment to guarantee women's suffrage.
- **November 9, 2023**: Admiral Lisa Franchetti was sworn in as the 33rd Chief of Naval Operations, the highest ranking office of the U.S. Navy. She is also the first woman to serve on the Joint Chiefs of Staff.
- **November 11, 1993**: The Vietnam Women's Memorial was dedicated in Washington, D.C. after being conceived by former army combat nurse Diane Carlson Evans and sculpted by Glenna Goodacre to honor 265,000 women who voluntarily served during the Vietnam era.
- **November 13, 1938**: Mother Francis Xavier Cabrini was beatified. She was the first American woman citizen to become a saint.
- **November 14, 1889**: Journalist Elizabeth Cochran, aka Nellie Bly, sailed around the world in 72 days, 6 hours, 11 minutes, and 14 seconds, beating the fictional record set by Phineas Fogg in Jules Verne's *Around the World in Eighty Days*.
- **November 15, 2023**: Janet Truncale became the first woman to head of a Big Four audit firm when Ernst & Young named her its global chief executive officer,

WOMEN IN MALE DOMINATED FIELDS - POLITICAL LEADERS SERIES

#2: WOMEN APPOINTED HEAD OF STATE IN THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER

Note: Many current and former women presidents and prime ministers are members of the Council of Women World Leaders, an international network whose mission is to mobilize the highest-level women leaders globally for collective action on issues of critical importance to women and equitable development.

November 16, 1979: Angela Merkel

8th Chancellor of the Federal Republic of Germany, serving from 2005 to 2021, the first female Chancellor. During her chancellorship, Merkel was referred to as the *de facto* leader of the European Union and the most powerful woman in the world. Beginning in 2016, Merkel was often described as the leader of the free world. She has a doctorate in quantum chemistry and worked as a research scientist before entering politics at age 39.

November 16, **1979: Lidia Gueiler Tejada**

56th President of Bolivia, serving from 2019 to 2020.

Gueiler was a life-long campaigner for human rights and against military regimes that blighted not only Bolivia but most of Latin America through much of her life. Her term as the first female president of Bolivian was only eight months long, sandwiched between two of her nation's traditional coups d'etat. Gueiler was the second female to serve as president in the western hemisphere, preceded five years earlier by Argentina's Isabel Peron, who broke the mold. In 1979 Gueiler was named United Nations Woman of the Year.

November 3, 1990: Gro Harlem Brundtland

29th Prime Minister of Norway, serving her third term from 1990 to 1996.

Brundtland started her first term as Prime Minister in 1981 and her second term in 1986. Gro was a physician and scientist in the Norwegian public health system and served as Director-General of the World Health Organization from 1998 to 2003. She served as U.N. Special Envoy on Climate Change from 2007 to 2010.

November 12, 1994: Chandrika Kumaratunga

5th President of Sri Lanka, serving from 1994 to 2005.

Chandrika was Sri Lanka's first female president, elected in the largest landslide victory in Sri Lankan history, with 62% of the votes cast. She was also Sri Lanka's 11th Prime Minister in 1994, the second female Sri Lanka prime minister. Chandrika's mother, Sirimavo, became the world's first female Prime Minister in 1960 when she was elected Prime Minister of Sri Lanka. Sirimavo returned for a third time as Prime Minister in 1994 to support her daughter's term as President.

November 14, 1994: Sirimavo Bandaranaike

6th Prime Minister of Sri Lanka, serving three terms from 1994 to 2005, 1970 to 1977 and 1960 to 1965. Sirimavo was the world's first female Prime Minister. She oversaw the formation of the Sri Lankan republic, formerly called Ceylon, separating it from the British Empire and establishing its political independence as a republic. In 2010, on the 50th anniversary of Bandaranaike's election as the world's first female prime minister, Sri Lanka Parliamentarian Rosy Senanayake reported Sri Lanka had not made significant progress towards gender equality in politics with only 4.5% of parliamentarians being women. In 2016 the Sri Lanka Legislature established a quota to achieve better gender representation, reserving 25% of all legislative seats for women.

November 7, 1995: Claudette Werleigh

7th Prime Minister of Haiti, serving from 1995 to 1996, Haiti's first female Prime Minister.

Claudette has had a long career in fields of adult literacy and humanitarian relief. She helped found the League for Women's Empowerment to promote women's participation in politics and bridge the gulf separating different worlds. She believes women are the backbone of society and have a great capacity for peace making.

#2: WOMEN APPOINTED HEAD OF STATE IN THE MONTH OF NOVEMBER

November 16, 2015: Beata Szydlo

16th Prime Minister of the Republic of Poland, serving from 2015 to 2017, the third woman to hold that office after Hanna Suchocka (5th) and her immediate predecessor Ewa Kpacz (15th).

The daughter of a coal-miner father and book-loving mother, Beata pursued a doctorate, worked in a museum and started her political career at age 35 as mayor of Brzeszcze.

November 30, 2017: Katrin Jakobsdottir

35th Prime Minister of Iceland, serving from 2017 to 2024, Iceland's second female Primed Minister after Jahanna Siguroardottir (31st).

Katrin was a popular politician who worked in education, science and culture positions in the government. In a 2015 poll, 59% of the respondents named her the most trustworthy politician in Iceland. She is retired from politics and just published her first novel, co-written with Ragnar Jonasson, *Reykjavik: A Crime Story*.

November 12, 2019: Jeanine Anez

66th President of Bolivia, serving from 2019 to 2020, Bolivia's second female President, after Lidia Gueiler Tejada (56th).

The civil unrest in Bolivia in 2019 forced mass resignations by Bolivia's President Evo Morales, Bolivia's Vice President and the Presidents of the Senate and the Chamber of Deputies. With no constitutional line of succession to the presidency, the Legislative Assembly installed Anez president, with the responsibility of calling a new election. In 2020 Morales, was re-elected president, and Anez was charged with working with police and military figures to orchestrate the coup that overthrew Morales. In 2022 she was sentenced to 10-years in a woman's prison and is currently appealing the sentence. She was also charged in 2023 with orchestrating the genocide during the 2019 protests and faces a possible 30-year prison term, also under appeal.

November 12, 2019: Mary Patricia McAleese

8th President of Ireland, serving from 1997 to 2011, second female President after Mary Robinson (7th). McAleese is the first woman in the world to succeed another woman as president. Mary was a popular president who addressed issues concerning justice, social equality, social inclusion, anti-sectarianism and reconciliation, with the theme "Building Bridges."

November 30, 2021: Sandra Mason

1st President of Barbados, serving from 2021 to today.

Mason was the 8th and final governor-general when Barbados was a constitutional monarchy. When Barbados became a republic on November 30, 2021, Sandra became the first President of Barbados. She was also the first woman member of the Barbados Bar Association and the first woman to serve on the Barbados Supreme Court

November 30, **2021: Magdalena Andersson**

34th Prime Minister of Sweden, serving from 2021 to 2022, Sweden's first female Prime Minister. In response to Russia's full-scale invasion of Ukraine in 2022, two female Prime Ministers, Magdalena Anderson of Sweden and Sanna Marin of Finland, reversed their countries' 200-year long positions of neutrality. They both applied to join NATO on May 18, 2022. On April 4, 2023 Finland became a NATO member followed by Sweden who became a NATO member on March 7, 2024.
